Students are allowed to be out of uniform but must abide by the following guidelines or will be sent home:

Shorts, skirts, or dresses

If you are wearing a pair of shorts, a skirt, or a dress, the length of the item must be NO shorter than fingertip length. Your entire backside must be covered.



Belts

Ripped Jeans

Absolutely no rips in jeans above the knee unless there is fabric underneath the rip. If skin can be seen above the knee through the rip, you will have to change your clothes or you will be sent home.
