This week the eighth graders will have a short cycle assessment on standard R.I.8.4 and I can wait to see how they demonstrate all of the new things we've learned!

The seventh grade has been working on standard R.I.7.5, and will have a short cycle assessment covering this standard on Friday. The standard addresses how authors use specific structures to help their audience comprehend their text. If you want to help your seventh grader get prepared for their short cycle, ask them if they can tell you the signal words for problem and solution, compare and contrast, description, chronological, sequence and cause and effect texts. They should also be able to tell you their go to transition words for their essays.
